

Snowbound

It was several years ago on two cold February days that southern California experienced an unusual snowstorm. For the first time in about thirty years, residents of the Los Angeles basin awoke to snow. It had been eight years since north Los Angeles County (Lancaster/Palmdale) had a major snowfall.

I didn't mind being "housebound" because it provided an opportunity to spend more time exploring my Roots 3 genealogy software program. Like shoveling snow, a lot of energy went into keyboarding family names into the computer. I made some entry errors so a number of hours were spent correcting data. Similarly, a person will shovel out a driveway only to have a fresh snowfall obliterate his labor.

With over 300 names in the program, it was time to experiment with printing the data. Usually I have "a gift for words," but I haven't enough adjectives to describe my excitement when Roots 3 printed my (limited) family

history in book form! The elaborate features prompted my purchase, but I truly wasn't aware that the program would automatically print in register form.

As I marveled, it occurred to me, "We can't do the job if we don't have the tools." We can't remove snow if we don't have a shovel. We can't print a professional family history with public domain software.

I know wherewith I speak! I have been using a R-E-M-A-R-K-A-B-L-Y G-O-O-D public domain/shareware program for two-and-one-half years. I've bragged on it; I've given away over one hundred copies! In excess of 5,500 family names were lovingly documented with two family history books in mind. As much as I love the program, it has its limitations. It would have been necessary to "cut and paste" a manuscript from two or more computer programs.

Back to my former illustration about tools: Heavy-duty equipment was necessary—a broom would not clear away six inches of snow. Genealogy software programs are a marvelous tool. (I wonder how researchers manage/ managed without a computer!)

Evaluate your needs. Are you interested in organizing your family history for personal satisfaction and immediate family? Do you plan to publish and market your family history? If you do not have grandiose plans, contact me about "free" genealogy software (for IBM and compatibles). Write to Commsoft, 2257 Old Middlefield Way, Mountain View, CA 94043, for information about their outstanding line of Roots software for most computer operating systems.

As I mentioned in an earlier article, my recommendation(s) come from personal satisfaction. No one asked me to critique or evaluate. The snowfall in usually temperate southern California provided the theme for this allegory.

Therefore I made the giant leap from a \$35.00 shareware genealogy software program to \$350.00 Roots III. I am producing family history books and I love Roots III!!! (Commsoft has begun to market Roots IV but I'm very comfortable with the earlier program.)

There are many good software programs on the market. Another inexpensive program you might consider: Personal Ancestral File (PAF). It is marketed by the L.D.S. (Mormon) Church, has excellent support, and only costs \$35.00 (or a little more).

Third: I'm surprised that you haven't yet found any leads to your Brethren ancestors. I've found the members to be very well documented and I have been blessed with more information than I can process (I am about one year behind on all the data I have to put into the computer!!) Another publication that

you should consider: Fellowship of Brethren Genealogist Newsletter. I don't have their address with me (at work) so will pen it at the bottom of this letter before I mail it. You'll want to get your surnames into their Surname Directory and you may want to write to those in the Surname Directory with your surnames. Sometimes it takes about two years to make all the right connections. Actually, I'm saying it took me about two years to make all the right connections and writing hundreds of letters. Correspondence is the "key" to success. I've been accused of subsidizing the U.S. Post Office and United Parcel (ha).

OK, here is another "key" to my success: I have Bishop Michael Frantz as my immigrant ancestor. He was an early leader in the Brethren Church and much revered. Almost everyone in the (Old Order) Old German Baptist Brethren have Frantz ancestry too. When I began to make contact with members of the O.G.B.B. the flood-gates of information swung wide open and I have been inundated with data. I go to their Annual Meetings and meet all my fifth and sixth cousins. my O.G.B.B. cousins!! They are so hospitable, kind, loving, thoughtful, considerate.... They are "not of this world" but of an earlier time and persuasion. If you don't already know, they are similar to the Amish and Old Order Mennonite. They don't own TV's, radios, tape recorders, etc. etc. They are very family oriented, devote Christians. Because of Frantz ancestry, and theirs, and because of my love for the Lord Jesus, I am warmly welcomed at their annual meetings and at their Love Feast(s).

Well enough of that. No, I didn't attend college in Mt. Morris, Illinois, but it was probably a Frantz "cousin" that your brothers knew.

In closing, my daughter lives in Michigan. She and her family live in the Upper Peninsula: Garden Corners. I visit there frequently. I wouldn't want to be in Michigan now because of the cold and snow. I'll ride out the earthquakes in Southern California instead.

Good luck with your research. Hope you find a software genealogy program that you like.

Of course, be sure that the other programs have GEDCOM so you can export from PAF to the new software. Sorry I can't be of more assistance.
