FRANCE

The France family is of German origin and there were several immigrants to the American Colonies by the name of France and its variants, Frants, Frans, Franse, Franz, and Frantz.

I. William France, the ancestor and the pioneer of this branch of the family, came to Southwestern Virginia and was in Washington County as early as 1784, and shown as a taxpayer that year. Later, he moved to Lee County and settled in Yokum Station before 1803. In this year, April 16, he witnessed a deed for William McCutcheon to Aaron Collier, along with Joseph Head, and March 26, 1806 he purchased 225 acres of land, lying on both sides of Powell River in Lee County, from Joseph Head for \$733 $\frac{1}{3}$. He resided with his family at this location until his death in 1834. In 1807, he further acquired a tract of land, lying in Poor Valley in Yokum Station, by grant in partnership with John Preston.

William France's wife was Elizabeth, born 1778, who may have been Elizabeth Heiskell. According to the 1850 census, Elizabeth was 72, and living with her son, William W. France, and the Lee County Death register shows: Elizabeth France died 1854, age 75. According to the 1830 census, William France was between 60 and 70. He died intestate and Elizabeth France qualified as administratrix of his estate, September 27, 1834, with Benjamin Davis, and John B. Collier her securities, and his estate was appraised November 11, 1834 by Daniel Reasor, David Olinger and John Olinger.

On the motion of William France praying for relief as security of Margaret Razor for her due and faithful administration of the estate of Michael Razor decd: This day came the parties by their counsel who being heard it is ordered that the said Margaret Razor give to said William France good counter security, the bond for which purpose is to be in the penalty of \$5000 and thereupon the said Margaret Razor together with James Flanary and Benjamin Davis entered into and acknowledged a bond in the manner required.

William and Elizabeth France had nine children:

1. Christian M. France, m. Mary E. Dickenson, daughter of Benjamin and Elizabeth (Ransom) Dickenson. He was active in the county and community affairs. They remained in Lee County, Virginia until after the death of Benjamin Dickenson, when they sold their land holdings, and first moved to Knox Co., Ky., later moved to Missouri and settled in Buchanan county, where they were residing in 1858. (DBK 12, 575; DBK 15, 1)
2. Lucinda France. m. Stephen T. Collier, son of Randolph and Catherine. (See the Collier Family.)
3. Mary France, b. 1800; d. 1862; m. about 1818, William Zion, b. 1799, son of John Sr. and Lucy. (See the Zion Family.)
4. Sarah (Sally) France, m. Job Chrisman.
5. John France, m. Mary Ann Duff, dau. of Samuel and Margaret (Olinger) Duff.
6. Peter France, m. 1st, in Jackson Co., Mo., name of wife unknown;

2nd, in Lee Co., Va., Sept. 20, 1853, Celia Ward, b. 1820 in Tenn.

7. Adam France, b. about 1810; d. 1837.

8. Henry France. No record of birth, marriage or death.

9. William W. France, b. about 1815-20.

7. Adam France (son of William Sr.), b. about 1810; d. 1837. His personal estate was appraised Dec. 30, 1837 by John Koger, David Olinger and John C. Olinger. He was married, October 13, 1831 by Andrew Hunter, to Frances (Fanny) Ely, b. June 16, 1811; d. Aug. 18, 1876. On 20 Nov. 1837, Frances France, with her securities, Hiram Ely, John Smith, Joseph Ely and John C. Olinger, qualified as administratrix, according to law of the estate of Adam France, deceased. (OBK 4-276)

The Court appointed Frances France guardian of her minor children, children named:

(1) William Heiskell France, b. Aug. 3, 1832. He was a Confederate soldier and served as private in Company A, 64th Regiment, William's Brigade, commanded by Captains Campbell Slemple, Alexander Morris and Joshua E. Hobbs. He was captured and sent to Camp Douglas, Illinois, a prisoner of War, where he died, unm. Nov. 5, 1864 of smallpox and is buried in Oakwoods Cemetery, Chicago, Illinois.

(2) Rebecca Reasor France, b. Jan. 30, 1835; d. June 11, 1909, near Freeman, Missouri; m. Feb. 4, 1852 in Blue Springs Church in Lee Co., Va., Richard Maloney, b. July 22, 1827; d. Aug. 6, 1899 near Freeman, Mo. They were married by J.D. Baldwin. (See the Maloney Family.)

(3) Lucinda France, b. about 1837; m. John M. Parsons. (See the Parsons Family.)

9. William W. France (son of William), b. 1815-20; m. 1st; Margaret Olinger, dau. of John Christopher II; 2nd, Sept. 30, 1851, Elizabeth Reese, b. 1820-25. By his first wife had three children:

(1) Elizabeth France, m. James Moore. (See the Olinger Family.)

(2) Henry France, d. of fever, 1862-3, a soldier in the Civil War.

(3) Lydia Anne France, b. 1846; m. July 30, 1868, William J. Parsons, b. 1845, son of John and Mary Lavina (Bishop) Parsons.

By his second wife William had several children:

(4) Adam R. France, b. March 26, 1856.

(5) William Z. France, b. Jan. 27, 1860.

(6) Heiskell France, b. Nov. 4, 1862.

(7) Mary A., b. 1853.

(8) Sarah T.E., b. 1855.

According to the 1860 census, William W. France was a blacksmith. After the death of his mother, William sold all his interest in the home tract of his father, being the part allotted to him by the division of said tract, to John Christopher Olinger, Nov. 20, 1855, for \$150. Later, William W. France moved to Tennessee and settled in Knox County where he was residing in 1879, when on Jan. 1, 1879, he sold 111 acres, lying on Powell River in Lee Co., Va., being the same land conveyed by Patrick Hagan, Commissioner of Circuit Court of Lee County, by deed April 1, 1853, to France for \$1100 to M.C. Parsons of Lee County, Virginia. (DBK 19-226)

William, Peter and John Franse came to Cass County probably in 1830. William P. Franse, son of John (Justice of the Peace, known as "Squire France," German descent, and Mary Ann (Duff) Franse, English descent. Born in Lee County, Virginia in 1837. The Franse family came to Jackson County, Missouri in 1837, to Cass County in 1839. William P. Franse married Miss Nancy Crosswhite of Campbell County, Tenn., daughter of William L. (English descent) and Elizabeth (Shown) Crosswhite (English and Scotch-Irish descent.) Children of William P. Franse: Albert Sidney, Capitola (m. forbears came from Amherst County. He and his wife, Catherine (Penn)
France, were distant cousins, both being descendants of Moses and Katherine
(Taylor) Penn. His father was William France (d 1811), the son of Peter
and Susan (Carter) France. His mother was Harriet Harrison (d 1876), the
daughter of Richard (d 1816) and Suzannah (Lee) Harrison (d 1832). In
1842 he married Catherine (Penn) the daughter of James and Mary (or
Polly) Shelton Penn. He had one sister, Susan Lee, who married Gabriel
Penn. His estate in Henry County was called Fairview. The original house
was burned. Fairview was situated on an elevated site in Henry County,
Virginia, and commanded a beautiful view of the Alleghany Mountains

Susan Lee France married first Gabriel Penn, son of Greensville Penn and Anna Leath Penn, of Penn's Store, Patrick County, Virginia. Of this union there were only two children, William Leath Penn, born July 29, 1834, and Edward Penn, born July 3, 1837. SMITH-RIFFE COLLECTION OF NEW RIVER GENEALOGY AND LOCAL HISTORY

John F. Vallentine*

The Smith-Riffe Collection represents a half century of genealogical and local-history research in the New River counties of southern West Virginia and adjacent Virginia. Although its owners over the years have always been willing to share its contents with interested people, the nature of the collection prevented its direct use by the general public. Plans were initiated in 1972 but not consummated until 1979 to have the entire collection organized and microfilmed. The microfilming was carried out by the Genealogical Society, Salt Lake City, Utah. As requested by Mrs. Nell Smith, the widow of Aubrey O. Smith, before her death on 24 June 1979, the original collection was donated to the Archives and History Division, Department of Culture and History, Charleston, West Virginia.

The collection was assembled by Aubrey O. Smith, a life-long resident of Beckley, West Virginia, with the assistance of his longtime friend, Judge Winton A. Riffe, also of Beckley. Beginning about 1930, the two began collaborative investigation of New River genealogy and local history; this joint effort over the next thirty years provided the beginnings of the collection and brought recognition to them as authorities on the pioneer families of the area. Partnership in the collection continued until the death of Judge Riffe in 1962, about which time sole ownership was transferred by purchase and assignment to Mr. Smith. In his will dated 20 July 1960, Judge Riffe devised to Aubrey O. Smith various personal items including "my stationery cabinet and its contents of whatever kind." During the period of 1962-78, the collection was greatly enlarged by the continuing efforts of Mr. Smith.
