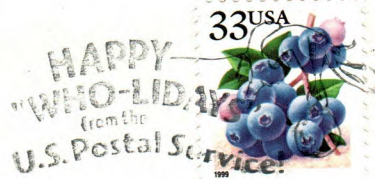

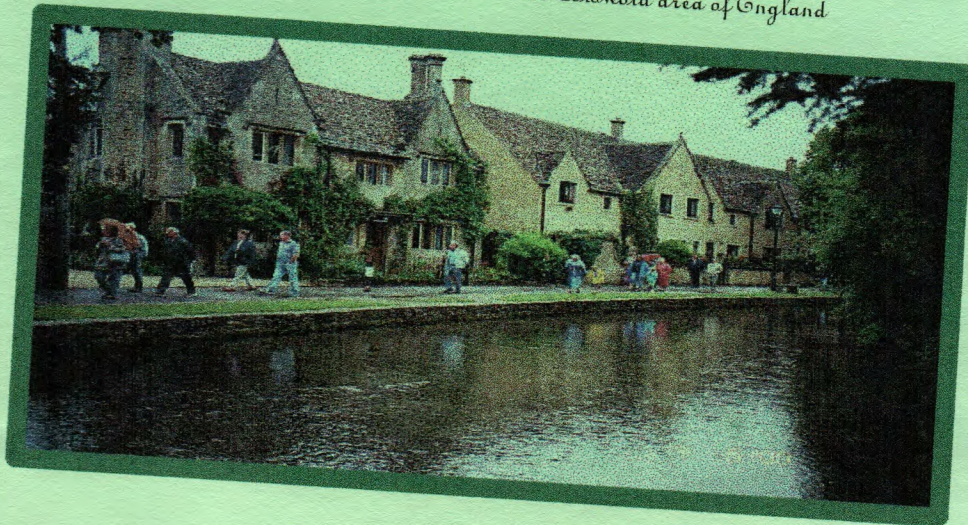

I was a Brubaker from North Manchester Ind. My father was born in Nebraska and raised in Kansas and married my mother, a Denlinger from Dayton. She still lives and at 91, just broke her hip and is in rehab at English Oaks Convalescent Hospital on Rumble Rd. My maternal grandmother was a Mohler from Covington and my paternal grandmother was a Fisher from Mexico, Ind. I have Mother Haney's diaries and a half dozen of her mother; Sarah (Smith) Fall's from 1899-1908. It is interesting that I was named after Sarah's sister Alice. She was married to my great uncle Amos Brubaker.
