Dear Rosemary,

I am sorry to have taken this long to gather my notes together but this is a busy time of year for we have a big garden and I am still working three days a week at the library.

This will turn out to be rather a hodge-podge but I find in going over the material that I am more than ever of the opinion that John Frantz of Manor Twp. (who died in 1787) was not the son of Balzer.

Deed Bk. EE Vol.2 p. 126-128 (I have a copy of this deed)  
~~1285~~ John Frantz to Jacob Frantz (spelled France within the body of the deed - does not specify relationship between John and Jacob but think it likely that it was father-son - this would be 2 years before John died) The deed states that the land was purchased the first day of Nov. 1741-2 by Christian France from Michael Baughman and Cathrina his wife. In turn Christian and Barbara his wife sold the land to John France on the 20th day of March 1746-7. (What was the relationship between John and Christian - was it possibly - father-Son? Is Christian the son of the immigrant Christian?) No mention is made in the deed of John's wife so she must have already been deceased at this time. (Which does not agree with your statement that John, the son of Balzer preceded his wife Catherine in death).

Also no mention is made of John's wife in his will, Will Book Y-2 p. 153. He bequeaths to sons John, Christian, Jacob and Michael "five hundred pounds of good money which each of them has already received in the lands which they have got from me." Daughter Elizabeth is given 570 pounds. Jacob Brubacher and Jacob Frantz (son of John) were named executors.

Deed Book N 3 p. 339 (I have a copy of this deed)  
30th May 1803 between John Frantz and Christian Frantz, Executors of Jacob Frantz - and John Frantz the younger, eldest son of Jacob Frantz deceased. This land is the same as that described in the above deed - Deed Book EE Vol. 2 p. 126-128. This deed quotes will of Jacob which names wife Maria and gives land to eldest son John and names other sons Jacob and Christian. His wife was pregnant at the time of Jacob's death. This child was Samuel. Samuel and Christian were children of second marriage to Maria Nissley. John, Anna and Jacob were children of first wife, Barbara Hostetter.

Deed Book FF Vol. 1 p. 405-406 14 day of Apr. 1786. Land in Warwick Twp. purchased by John Frantz of Donegal Twp. from Peter Sneider and Susannah his wife. This was my John. He lived on this land until he died in 1821 although the land had been taken over prior to that by his youngest son, Christian (my great, great grandfather. Christian left Lancaster Co. in 1825 and went to Franklin Co. where he purchased land on the Little Antietam Creek. He married Anna Royer Frick, daughter of Abraham Frick and the widow Christiana Royer Zug. Anna Frick went by the name of Nancy. Deed John T.

Christian was a bishop in the Reformed Mennonite Church and the first of this church to come to Franklin County. He was very active in church work and started the church at Ringgold, Md.. This is very close to Waynesboro, near where Christian's home was. As far as I know he never lived in Maryland although one of his sons did. He sold his farm to his son Isaac and purchased a small farm on the outskirts of Waynesboro. This home is a beautiful home today, slightly remodeled. The house still stands on the first property, also, but I am not sure whether it was there when Christian lived there or not. I know that it was there in 1855 when my grandfather Landis was born there. I have been to the courthouse in Chambersburg and verified Christian's purchase of lands.

But back to Lancaster Co. At the Lancaster Co. Historical Soc. I read through the tax records for Manor Twp. From 1754-1777 there was only one Frantz - John - variously spelled France, Francis, Frank and Frantz. From the description of the land it was the same man. Beginning in 1779 there was also Jacob Frantz, Jacob Frank and another John. In 1780 there were 2 Jacob Frantzes and 2 Johns. In 1781 there was a Jacob France and no John, probably an error. 1787-1789 there were two Johns. 1790-1793 one John. 1797 a John and a Johan and 1799 a John, a Johan and a Jacob.

I looked at some Warwick Twp. tax records. 1800-1806 John Frantz and Jacob Frantz. 1807 John and Jacob and a John Frank. In 1808 Christian first appears along with Jacob and John Frank. Christian was married in 1808 and it was about this time that he took over the home place.

I own Mayhill's "Lancaster Co. Pa. Deed Abstracts 1729-cl770 and Oaths of Allegiance". From that I have taken the following: E 113 John Frances mor, to Michael Frances - states that John was a son of Balzer. This was in 1756 and both John and Michael were listed as being from Cocalico Twp. (At this time John of Manor Twp. had already been living in Manor Twp where he bought his land in 1746-7)

Also from Mayhill C 181 Jacob Horning (Hanning) and wife Elizabeth to Jacob Fetter. This land on west side of Conestoga Creek was patented 7 June 1734 to Peter Martin who with wife Elizabeth on 14 Oct. 1745 granted to John Frans (Frantz) who with wife Elizabeth granted it to Jacob Hening in 1747.

It is quite possible that the Hostetter family had an influence on the John Frantz family becoming Mennonites if there were not already. They were very close. Jacob Hostetter in his will dated 10th day of Jan. 1756 said "It is my order that my beloved son Jacob Hostetter and my beloved friend John Frantz---divide all my estate to take care of my widow-----," The will was affirmed in 1761. Of course my John married Elizabeth Hostetter and his brother Jacob married Barbara Hostetter, Elizabeth's sister. Where John and Elizabeth were living in Warwick Twp. adjacent land was owned by Abraham Hostetter, undoubtedly Elizabeth's brother.
