Will of Catherine Frantz Proved July 3, 1833

The last will and testament of Catherine Frantz, widow of Peter Frantz, late Of Ross Township, Northampton County, Pa., deceased.

I Catherine Frantz, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, viz: First, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah, the wife of George Shafer, Thirty Dollars; and to my daughter Catherine, the wife of Jacob Smith is to have Thirty Dollars in money, one bed and bedstead, one chest and my clock; also I give and bequeath unto my son, John Frantz, now of the Little Munsey Creek, the sum of Thirty Dollars & also give and bequeath unto heirs of my son George Frantz, deceased the sum of Thirty Dollars to be divided in equal shares among said heirs; and I also give and bequeath unto the heirs of my son Peter Frantz, deceased, the sum of Thirty Dollars to be divided in equal shares, and to my daughter, Maria, the wife of John Smith Jr. the sum of Thirty Dollars, and to my son Jacob Frantz the sum of Thirty Dollars, and to my son Jones Frantz the sum of Thirty Dollars, and I also give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Frantz, Thirty Dollars in money, one bed and bedstead, one chest, and to my son Michael Frantz, Thirty Dollars in money, and I also give and bequeath unto my grandchild Linford Frantz my clock and case, and my beloved daughter Susanna, the wife of Joseph Metzger, the sum of Thirty Dollars; and to my beloved son Solomon Frantz the sum of Thirty Dollars, and lastly as to all the rest, residue and remainder of my personal estate, goods and chattels of what kind and nature whatsoever I give and bequeath the same to my son Samuel Frantz, whom I hereby appoint my sole executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this 28th. day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.

Signed and sealed in the presence of Jacob Frantz and David Schmidt. The proving of the will follows in legal form, signed by Geo. Hess Jr. Register. Sworn to July 3rd. 1833.

Was killed and Scalped, Martin Yager and his Wife, and John Croushores wife and one Child, and the Wife of Abraham Secler and one Child of one Adam Clauce and the Wife of John Coucchere, and the wife of Abraham Secler was Sculot and is yet Alive, But Badly wounded, one Shot Thro' the Sid and the other in the Thy, and two Children kild Belonging to said Croushere, and one to said Secler, and one Belonging to Philip Antone Not Sculpt, and this Was Don at Least three Miles within the out side Settlers, and 4 miles from John Everett's, and Philip Antone's wife was one that Took her Tilit and came hom and acquainted her husband, and he came and Acquainted me, and I went Emeaditly to the Place With Seven men Besides my Self and Saw the Murder, But the Indians was Gon and I Drectly Purs'ed them about 4 Miles and Came Up with them in the thick Groves weaire Wee met with Nine Indians, and one Sprung Behind a Tree and took Site at me and I run Direct at him, and another one the sid Flast at me, and then Both took to there Heals, and I shot one as I Goge Thro' the Body, as he fell on his face, But I Loaded and after another that was Leding A maire, and ye meane time he Got up and Run away and I fired on the other, and I think I shot him in ye Buttux, and my Soldiers had oppertunity to shot three times, and then they Got out of oure Site in the thick Groves, and Wee Cold Not find them No more, But I Got from them one maire and two Saddels, one Bridel and Halter, & one Bag with a Cag of Stil Licker in it, and Cloths and one Brace Cittel and fore Indian Cake Baked in the ashes of wheat meal and to Aquat you further, that I have several New Soldiers that has No Guns, and were Little Powder and Led, and I have sent this Express to you Hoping that you Wold Help me with Arms and Ammenishan, and so I Remaine yours friend and humble Servent

"JACOB WETHERHOLD."

Referring to this sad occurrence, Col. Weiser writes Gov. Denny from Easton on July 15th: "In coming thro' the Maxitawny, I heard a melancholly Account of Ten People being killed by the Enemy Indians. They passed by two or three Plantations on this side of the mountain before they attacked. A certain woman ran off towards her Place and told her Husband of the attack, who cut the Gears off his Horses then in the Plow, and rid as fast as he could to Lieut. Wetherholts, about three miles off. Lieut. Wetherholt, with a small Detachment,

I am told Seven in number, came away immediately, and came to the Place where the murder was committed, where, by that time, a number of people had gathered. Wetherholt proposed to pursue the Enemy but none would go with him, so he took his Seven men & pursued the Enemy a few miles from the House & found the Place where they rested themselves, and in abt three miles He overtook them in thick Brushes, at a very little Distance. It seems they saw one another at once. One of the Indians was before hand with Whetherholt & aimed at him, but his Gun flashed. Wetherholt, a moment after, fired at the Indians, and thinks he hit him, but is not sure. Several Guns were fired by our People but did no Execution, and the Indians Guns missing Fire they ran off & left two Horses behind them, one belonging to the man they killed, laden with the best of his Household Goods."

About the same time the Indians carried off a young lad named John Schoep, about nine years old, whom they took by night, seven miles beyond the Blue mountain; where, according to the statement of the lad, the Indians kindled a fire, tied him to a tree, took off his shoes and put moccasins on his feet; that they prepared themselves some mush, but gave him none. After supper they marched on further. The same Indians took him and another lad between them, and went beyond the second mountain, having gone six times through streams of water; and always carried him across. The second evening they again struck up fire, took off his moccasins, and gave him a blanket to cover himself; but at midnight, when all the Indians were fast asleep, he made his escape, and by daybreak had traveled about six miles. He passed on that day, sometimes wading streams neck-deep, in the direction of the Blue mountain. That night he stayed in the woods. The next day, exhausted and hungry, he arrived by noon at Uly Meyer's plantation, where Charles Folk's company lay (probably at or near Fort Franklin), where they wished him to remain till he had regained strength, when they would have conducted him to his father. He was accordingly sent home. (C. Sauer's German Paper, March, 1756.)

In September, 1757, occurred one of the bold-est forays of the Indians that is recorded. A party of redskins crossed the Blue mountains and passing through Heidelberg township came to a creek where two young girls were washing flax (or another account, says, cleaning an apple butter kettle). Tradition has it that they were guarded by a man with a gun near by. An Indian snatched one of the girls, named Margaret

Frantz, aged 12 years, and the guard was unable to fire for fear of hitting the girl. The other girl is said to have been named Solt.

Margaret Frantz was the daughter of Henry Frantz, and was born in Lorraine, May 8, 1745. Henry Frantz, arrived at Philadelphia on October 20th, 1747, together with Abraham and Peter Frantz. On December 4th, 1749, a warrant was granted to Henry Frantz for 50 acres "behind the land of one Silby in a hollow over the Blue mountains." He paid at the rate of £15 10 s per 100 acres and ½ penny quit-rent per acre. Henry Frantz settled in Heidelberg township where he took out a warrant for land on Nov. 14th, 1758. In 1762 he was taxed ten pounds in Heidelberg township, and in the tax list of 1764 we find his name written "Henry France, 200 acres," with no amount of tax stated, and these words, "Killed by Indians." From the most reliable account obtainable, he was killed and scalped by Indians in the year 1764, while butchering hogs. It is said that the Indians pricked a mark resembling a hen's foot, or, as some say, leaves, on the right wrist, rubbing it in with powder.

Letters of administration on his estate were taken out by his brother Peter Frantz, and in the proceedings of the Orphans' Court of June 10, 1764, we find that Henry France, deceased, left two children, Barbara, aged about 16 years, and Peter, aged 12 years. Barbara chose Abraham Frantz as her guardian and the Court appointed him also guardian of Peter Frantz. No mention is made here of Margaret, the eldest daughter, of whom we shall speak later. Peter Frantz, the son, was born May 4, 1752, and died May 25, 1832. He married Anna Catherine Buchman, and is buried in the old Allentown Cemetery.

Years after her return from captivity Margaret Frantz related to Peter Hecker that the Indians placed her on a horse and crossed a big water (probably the Lehigh river near Weissport), on the way towards Stroudsburg, and turned into the famous hunting grounds through the Delaware Water Gap. Here we lose all trace of her until her return after seven years in 1764. Of the manner of her return we have no information. Five years after her return from captivity, on May 9, 1769, she was married to Nicholas Wotring. She became noted far and wide for her knowledge of herbs and simples, which she acquired from the Indians, and her services in curing the sick were in great demand. Her journeys while on these errands, she always accomplished on horseback. She died June 29, 1823, aged 78 years, 1 month and 21 days, and is buried in the old cemetery at Unionville.

Nicholas Wotring, her husband, was born in Pistorf, Lorraine, in April, 1745, and died July 15, 1818. They had six children: Samuel, born Sept. 9, 1772; John Peter, born Sept. 17, 1774, died in infancy; John Nicholas, born June 24, 1776, died Jan. 16, 1827; John Peter, born June 24, 1776, twin, died Feb. 25, 1833; John Henry, born Nov. 9, 1778, died March 25, 1850, married Maria B. Heintzelman and had two children, and Mary Susanna Wotring, born Nov. 15, 1780.

John Peter Wotring, one of the twins, born in 1776, married Elizabeth Deshler, daughter of Adam Deshler, Jr., and his wife, Mary Catherine Balliet, and had nine children.

For some reason the Frantz family suffered severely from the Indians, as in June, 1758, John Frantz's wife was killed and three children captured in Tulpehocken township, Berks county.

At Lehigh Gap, on the north side of the mountain, a blockhouse was erected in the latter part of the year 1755, by various families of the neighborhood, in which they sought refuge when in danger of Indian attacks. It was a position of importance, but was never occupied by a large force of soldiers. Franklin, in his letter of January 26, 1756, from Fort Allen, to the Governor, says:

"Sir:

"We left Bethlehem the 10th instant with Foulk's Company, 46 men, the Detachment of McLaughlin's 20, and 7 waggons laden with Stores and Provisions. We got that night to Hays' Quarters, where Wayne's Company, joined us from Nazareth.

"The next day we marched cautiously thro' the Gap of the Mountain, a very dangerous Pass, and got to Uplinger's but twenty-one miles from Bethlehem, the Roads being bad and the Waggons moving slowly."

The only other record we have is from the Journal of Jas. Young, when inspecting the various forts in June, 1756, viz:

"June 22—At 4 P. M. Sett out (from Fort Allen), at 6 came to Leahy Gap where I found a Serjeant and 8 men Stationed at a Farm house with a small Staccade Round it, from Fort Allen here the Road is very hilly and Swampy, only one Plantation ab't a mile from the Gap. I found the People here were a Detachment from Cap't (Nicholas) Weatherholts Comp'y, he is Station'd on the other side of the Gap, 3 miles from this with 12 men, the rest of his Comp'y are at Depues and another Gap 15 miles from this. I dispatch'd a messenger to Capt'n Weatherholt, desiring him to Come here in the morning, with the men under his Com'd, to be muster'd the People Stationed here and on

family are members of St. Paul's Lutheran church. Socially he belongs to the following organizations: F. O. E.; Loyal Order of Moose; Lehigh Democratic Club; Modern Woodmen of America and Columbia Fire Co. In 1903 he was married to Rachel E. Roth, a daughter of A. P. and Ida V. (Trexler) Roth. Two children less their union, namely: Loraine N. T., and Claire S.

Samuel Frankenfield, son of Adam, was born Feb. 8, 1786. He settled in what is now South Whitehall township, Lehigh county, near the Iron Bridge. He was a farmer and his homestead is now owned by the Lewis Hunsicker estate. He filled the office of poor director of the county and was tax collector for some years. He died Sept. 21, 1877, in his 92nd year of his age and is buried on the Union Cemetery, Allentown. He was married to Maria Magdalena Frey, born in 1784, and died in 1856. Their son, Enoch, born in 1784, and died in 1856. Their

Enoch Frankenfield, son of Samuel, succeeded his father as farmer on the old homestead which he conducted for a number of years. Later he lived at Meyersville, where he died in 1893, aged 77 years. He was married to Helena Ruch, daughter of David Ruch. To his family the following children were born: David, who was accidentally shot, aged 19 years; Samuel, mentioned later; Eli, lives at Rittersville; Dallas, a farmer living at Meyersville, and Maggie, wife of James Kemmerer, of Egypt.

Samuel Frankenfield, son of Enoch, was born in South Whitehall township where he followed farming for a number of years. He was also a contractor at stone quarries, selling stones for furnace purposes and employed as many as twenty-five men. Later he became the owner and proprietor of Albrights Hotel, which he conducted sixteen years. After Mr. and Mrs. Frankenfield had died their children sold the farm to a real estate company, who cut it up into building lots, which is now known as Clifford Park. Mr. Frankenfield was married to Miss Muth, a daughter of Solomon Muth. They had the following children: Samuel, deceased; Alfred, deceased; Agnes; James; Mary; Helen; Hattie; Edgar; Ada, deceased and William T.

WILLIAM T. FRANKENFIELD, of Whitehall township, was born November 29, 1883. He was educated in the public schools and the American Commercial school. In 1900 he became connected with the Allentown Manufacturing Company whose works are located between Allentown and Helfrich's Spring. He started at the bottom in order to familiarize himself thoroughly with the manufacturing of paint in all its different forms, and worked his way through the various departments and in 1910 he became the foreman of the works, having under his charge twenty men. Mr. Frankenfield is a member of the Modern Woodmen of America; and the Reformed congregation of Mickley's church, in which he takes an active interest being a member of the choir and assistant superintendent of the Sunday school. In 1903 he was married to Mary R. Helfrich, a daughter of Tilghman Helfrich. They have three children: Margaret A. E., William T., and Samuel.

FRANTZ FAMILY.

The Frantz family in America has its origin in Anthony Frantz, who landed in Philadelphia, Oct. 20, 1747, with his three sons, Peter, Jacob, and Henry. He located on the Ontelaunee creek, near the Blue mountains. He and his brother were soldiers in the French and Indian War and both were killed by the savages.

Henry Frantz, son of Anthony, secured a warrant for land, Nov. 14, 1758. In 1762, he was assessed £10 in Heidelberg township. In the tax list for 1764 we find his name written "Hy France" 200 acres, but no amount of tax stated. He was killed by Indians in 1764. He had three children: Margaret, who was carried off by the Indians in September, 1757; Peter, born May 4, 1752, died May 26, 1832, and was interred in the old Allentown cemetery; and Barbara Frantz, born in 1756.

Peter Frantz, son of Anthony Frantz, was born about 1734. He married Elizabeth, and they had a daughter, Christina Barbara, born in 1756.

Jacob Frantz, son of Anthony Frantz, was born in 1742. After he had attained his majority he took up 400 acres of land near Unionville, where he erected a store and hotel building and also had a distillery. He was also a blacksmith. In 1785 he was taxed on two horses and two cows and in 1786 he was taxed on 130 acres of land. Jacob Frantz married Margaret, and had children: Susanna; Henry Anthony; and John George, born June 12, 1776, married in 1800, Catharine Kuhns, died June 8, 1848. Issue: ten children, names unknown. John George and his brother Henry Anthony purchased a farm on Mill creek in 1801.

Heinrich Frantz had a farm of 300 acres in North Whitehall township, now the property of his great-grandson, James Frantz. Mr. Frantz was a member of the Reformed church at Egypt, where he is buried. He married, in 1796, Margaretha Ritter, born Oct. 14, 1775. Issue: Jacob; Abraham, born May 18, 1808, a farmer in North Whitehall township; Joseph; Daniel, who had the homestead; Heinrich, who died in the Carbon county poor house; William, who lived in North Whitehall township; Lydia; Mrs. Geo. Wright, who died at the age of 96 years, and Mrs. Daniel Rinker.

Joseph Frantz, a son of Heinrich and Margaretha Frantz, was born April 7, 1804, and died Sept. 20, 1877. He was a farmer in North Whitehall township and owned the farm now the property of William Everett. He was a member of the Reformed church at Egypt and served as an elder. His wife was Salome Roth. She was born Oct. 29, 1808, and died March 20, 1872, aged 63 years, 4 months and 21 days. Their children were: Elias; Amandes; Thomas; Tilghman; and Catharine, wife of David Brown.

Amandes Frantz, son of Joseph and Salome Frantz, an aged resident of Schiedys, North Whitehall township, was born Jan. 16, 1830. He was an undertaker for thirty-five years and retired from business in 1902. He has lived in his present residence since 1865 and has two tracts of land, 47 acres each, and a nine-acre woodland tract in Washington township. He was also a carpenter and contractor for many years. He erected a number of buildings and employed a large force of men. His wife was Caroline Smith, daughter of Frederick Smith, of Upper Saucon township, a native of Germany, who is buried at Friedensville church. They had eleven children, all living: Joseph; Sarah, wife of James Mertz; Benjamin, a contractor of Allentown; Christiana, wife of Jos. Marsteller; Kate, wife of Henry Zellner; Josephine, wife of Emil Phillips; Rev. Hiram A.; Annie, wife of George Semmel; Rev. Orville R.; Amelia, wife of Rev. Wm. H. Millhouse; and Tilghman S.

TILGHMAN S. FRANTZ, son of Amandes Frantz, was born Aug. 27, 1874. He received his education in the public schools and the Tamaqua high school. Early in life he was a photographer for a year in Allentown and Ohio, then followed the trade of a carpenter for three years. In 1898 he began cultivating the homestead, which he has since followed. He is a member of the Improved Order of Red Men, and of the Reformed church at Egypt. On Nov. 12, 1905, he was married to Laura Dengler. Issue: Hiram A., Earl L., and Elsie L.

Elias Frantz, a son of Joseph and Salome

Frantz, was a photographer and travelled through the eastern section of Pennsylvania. Later he purchased the homestead farm and conducted it. He was a Republican in politics and a member of the Reformed church at Egypt, where he served as deacon during the pastorate of Rev. Hofford. He was a member of the I. O. O. F. His wife was Harriet Kern, daughter of Gabriel Kern. Their children were: Edwin, who met an accidental death; Oscar; Willoughby, who also met an accidental death; Oliver; Chester E.; Amanda, wife of Henry Balliet, deceased; and Kate, wife of Oliver Schreiber.

CHESTER E. FRANTZ, of Catasauqua, son of Elias Frantz, was born in North Whitehall township, May 15, 1865. He attended the public schools of his native township, select schools at Coplay and North Whitehall, and West Chester Normal School. He began the profession of teaching when sixteen years old, teaching two terms in Carbon county, and twenty-three terms in Lehigh county, fifteen in Hanover, and eight in North Whitehall township. In 1907, he accepted a position as clerk for the Davies & Thomas Foundry, which position he has served to the present time. He is a member of the P. O. S. of A., Camp 301; and K. G. E., Castle No. 241, of Catasauqua. He is a member of Salem's Reformed church of Catasauqua, where he held the office of deacon, and is superintendent of the Zion's Lutheran and Reformed Sunday school of East Catasauqua. In politics he is a Republican and served his borough as school director for three years, and was tax collector and census enumerator of Hanover township in 1900 and 1910.

On Nov. 21, 1885, he married Lillie Herling, daughter of Jacob and Cecelia (Schaffer) Herling, natives of Baden, Germany, and granddaughter of Jesse Schaffer, of North Whitehall township. The family resides at 467 Race street. Mr. and Mrs. Frantz have four children: Stanley E. J., William H., Russell H., and Irene C.

David Frantz, a son of David, was a farmer in North Whitehall township. He died at the age of 27 years. He was a member of the Unionville Reformed church, where he is buried. He was a painter by trade and helped to paint the Unionville church. His wife was Mary Landis, daughter of Levi Landis. Their two sons were: George D. and Edward, deceased.

GEORGE D. FRANTZ, son of David and Mary Frantz, was born in 1873 and reared upon the farm. In 1902 he settled near Neff's postoffice, and in 1905 he engaged in farming in North Whitehall. He has a 20-acre tract along the public road from Slatington to Allentown, formerly the home of Drs. Hoffman and Wilson. He

is a member of the Reformed church at Unionville.

In 1808 he married Arabella Troxell, daughter of Paul and Mary (Schneck) Troxell. Their children are Rachel M., and Paul D.

Abraham Frantz, a farmer, lived in North Whitehall and is buried at Egypt Reformed church. He and his wife had the following children: Rebecca, who married Henry Zerfass; Louisa, who married Wm. Miller; Flora, who married Lewis Miller; Eliza, who married Jacob Steckel; Celinda, who married Solomon Miller; Elmira, who married Levi Kleckner; Oliver, who lived in Whitehall; and Henry B.

Henry B. Frantz lived in South Whitehall. He was a farmer in early life and later sold oil. He was a member of the Reformed Church and is buried at Egypt. He was first married to a Miss Ritter and had no children. He was married, second, Amanda Zerfass and had the following children: Sylvester; Martha, who married Jas. Kohler; Paulina, who married Herman Schroeder; Abraham, who married Annie Dreisbach; Ezra, who married Mary E. Young; and Ada, who married Wm. Faust.

Sylvester H. Frantz, of West Coplay, a foreman at the Coplay Cement Company, was born Sept. 4, 1864, and worked in a stone quarry for many years. On July 24, 1885, he married Anna M. Brown, daughter of Henry A. and Anna M. (Smith) Brown, and granddaughter of Joel and Amelia Brown. Mr. Frantz is one of the oldest employees of the Coplay Manufacturing Company, having been in their employ since their organization. He is a member of the Independent Order of Americans and of the Egypt Reformed church. He owns several houses in West Coplay and two in Coplay. Mr. Frantz and his wife have the following children: Henry A., who married Maggie Ramer and has two sons: Sylvester and Mervin; Frederick G., who is a cement tester in the employ of the United States Government in the construction of the Panama Canal; and Edna I., who married Chas. Miller and has two children: Anna and Erma.

FREDERICK G. FRANTZ was born in Whitehall township, May 4, 1887, and began working in the cement industry at the age of fifteen years, and was in the employ of the Lehigh Portland Cement Company for five years. On June 11, 1909, he was appointed by the Federal Government, under civil service, as a "Physical Tester" of cement used in the construction of the Panama Canal.

He is a member of Improved Order of Red Men, No. 201, Lecha Wonk Tribe, of Allentown, and the Independent Order of Americans, No. 753, of Allentown.

FREDERICK FAMILY.

The last will and testament of John Frederick is recorded in Will Book 10, p. 601, in the court house at Doylestown, the county seat of Bucks county, Pennsylvania. He was a pioneer and the ancestor of a representative Pennsylvania family, and may be a descendant of Henry Frederick, who had been a resident at Germantown in 1734. The Pennsylvania Archives record him, a taxable resident of Rockhill township, in 1779, and as owning in that year, 50 acres of land, 1 horse and 2 cattle. His name likewise appears in the following recorded tax lists: 1781, 1782, 1784, 1785, 1787. Beginning with 1781, he was assessed with 100 acres of land, 2 horses and 4 cattle. In 1782, as well as in later tax lists the name of Yost Frederick also appears. He is said to have been the oldest son of John Frederick, but his name does not appear in the latter's will. Tradition states that Joseph (or Yost) was only a half brother to Henry, Barbara, Michael, George, John, and Catharine Frederick.

In 1784 John Frederick, the pioneer, is recorded as being the head of a household consisting of eleven persons, 100 acres of land, and one dwelling house.

On the thirteenth day of January, 1808, John Frederick made his last will and testament. The absence of reference to his wife is conclusive proof that she died before the making of the will. That he died at a very advanced age is certain. His estate he divided into six parts, each of the following named children receiving one-sixth part: Henry; Barbara, intermarried to John Rinker; Michael; George; John, and Catharine, intermarried with Ludwick Wile. The second son, Michael, was appointed administrator of his father's estate. The will was proved Feb. 12, 1828. In Deed Book 54, p. 382, it is recorded that Michael Frederick, executor of John Frederick, late of Rockhill township sold a tract of land, April 11, 1829, to Barnet Headman, a noted potter of the Revolutionary period.

Henry Frederick, oldest son of John, was born prior to the Revolutionary War. He was a blacksmith on an adjoining tract to the homestead of his parents. He made his will in 1859 and died in February, 1863. He was survived by his wife Mary. They had no issue.

Michael Frederick, the second son of John, was born Oct. 27, 1769, died Jan. 13, 1849 in his eightieth year of age. He was married to Catharine Stump, born Jan. 15, 1764, died July 31, 1849, aged 85 years, 6 months, and 16 days. Both are buried at the Tohickon church, in Bucks county. He was a weaver by trade and a farmer by occupation. He lived in the vicinity of the

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cord of his varied, useful and honorable career be perpetuated.

V. Ashby was born April 25, 1818, in Shelby county, Kentucky. His family furnished so many of the sterling citizens of Montgomery county, Indiana, where our subject came with the rest of the family in 1844, that he grew to manhood and received such education as the schools of that early time afforded, for the country was new and when he arrived here, but here he was content to spend the remainder of his life, having faith in its future.

On June 3, 1844, he was united in marriage to Dulcena Lockridge, daughter of Robert and Elizabeth (Malone) Lockridge, the former born in Kentucky in 1786. Elizabeth Malone was a daughter of Andrew (Ozier) Malone. Robert Lockridge was a son of John and (Anderson) Lockridge. Andrew Malone was a soldier in the War of 1812. The father of Dulcena Lockridge died in Kentucky and she was left with nine children, three of whom were married and grew to maturity. In the year 1835 the widow and all but one of the children came to Putnam county, Indiana, and located south of Ladoga and there Dulcena lived until her marriage.

On V. Ashby and wife were born three children, namely: Robert L., and Elizabeth Louise, the latter being now the mother of the subject. They all live in Ladoga, Indiana, where they are very well respected.

V. Ashby was a farmer by profession and was very successful. He was the owner of two excellent farms near the center of Scott township, containing about five hundred and sixty acres. He was a man of capacity and energy and managed his large landed estate with skill and attention that always insured success and he ranked with the progressive agriculturists and stock men of Montgomery county in his day. His land was well improved and carefully operated, and his home which was noted for its hospitality.

He was a well read man, keeping advised on the current topics of the day and became well known locally as a debater, taking great interest in the societies. In fact, he remained a great student all his life, with the best literature of the day, reading extensively of it, by which he might advance himself and he ranked, justly, too, as one of the intellectual men of the southern part of the county. He

taught school in his younger days. He took a lively interest in church affairs and was an elder in the Presbyterian church. His life was of such influence for good, in favor of religion and all that made for moral uplift, temperance, righteousness and good citizenship. He did a great work against the liquor traffic, and when near his death he read a temperance speech in Ladoga, which was said by all fortunate enough to hear it to be the best ever heard in this locality.

Mr. Ashby was called to his eternal rest in April, 1903. His widow is still living, making her home in Ladoga. She is an unusually well preserved woman, although now past eighty-eight years of age. The advancing years, cruel to many, have left but a few threads of silver in her hair, and her eyes are clear and bright. Her hearing is as good as that of many young persons, and her face bears that unmistakable mark of one whose life is lived uprightly, with kindly thoughts for others and charitable impulses.

WILLIAM M. FRANTZ.

It would be hard to find a more painstaking and energetic tiller of the soil in Montgomery county than William M. Frantz, of Clark township, a man who has worked hard and never depended upon others to his work or his planning, and the success that has come to him has been well deserved in every respect and we are glad to give his life record space in this volume along with other deserving citizens of this locality.

Mr. Frantz was born in Scott township, this county, about a mile west of Ladoga, on June 19, 1864. He is a son of Frank and Elizabeth (Myers) Frantz. Matthias Frantz, the first of the name of whom we are informed, was born in Lancaster county, Pennsylvania, September 3, 1808. His mother's maiden name was Hants, and she was a sister of Katherine Hants, who married John Myers, Sr., and for a fuller account of this family the reader's attention is respectfully directed to the sketch of Frantz O. Myers, appearing in this volume. Matthias Frantz's mother died when the boy was four or five days old, and he was taken into the family circle of his aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. John Myers, Sr. With them he went to Botetourt county, Virginia, and lived there on the Myers farm until he grew to manhood. In 1831 he came on horseback with his uncle and his cousin, Henry Myers, from Virginia to the present site of Ladoga, Indiana, to visit John Myers, Jr., who was here beginning on works of great importance to the new

community. Later the three men returned to the old Virginia home and prepared to move here, and it was in the fall of 1833 that the Myers family, including Matthias Frantz, made the long overland trip in wagons to Montgomery county, Indiana, locating in the vicinity of Ladoga, where they established permanent homes and took an active part in building up the community.

Matthias Frantz entered land two miles west and one mile north of Ladoga, and this he improved and established his home thereon, and here he married Sally Graybill. He followed farming all his life. He took an interest in public affairs and was a pioneer justice of the peace, was also a deacon in the Dunkard church. His death occurred on July 1, 1898, his wife having preceded him to the grave on June 23, 1894. To them the following children were born: James P., William H., Sarah J., Elizabeth, and John Frank.

John Frank Frantz was born on January 18, 1838, on the farm where his father had settled in pioneer times, and there he grew to manhood and in 1859 married Elizabeth Myers, a daughter of William and Lydia (Harsharger) Myers. For her ancestry the reader is directed to the sketch of Frantz O. Myers, elsewhere in this volume. She was born November 1, 1838, a mile west of Ladoga, where her father, William Myers, was a pioneer settler. Frank Frantz bought a farm north of her father's farm, and farmed there all his life. Six children were born of his first marriage; the first an infant son, died unnamed on December 19, 1859; Leona Ellen, born February 27, 1861, died February 17, 1864; the third and fourth, twin sons, died unnamed in infancy on March 16, 1863; William H., born June 19, 1864; Sarah L., born August 29, 1866, was the wife of Frank Williams, and she died July 6, 1902. The mother of the above named children died July 6, 1878, when William M., of this sketch, was fourteen years old.

After the death of his first wife Frank Frantz married Emma Tapp, a daughter of John and Amanda Tapp. She was born and reared in Scott township, this county, three miles west of Ladoga. Two children were born of this union, May and Gaynelle. In 1897 Matthias Frantz, being feeble from advanced age, his family moved in with him to care for him. His death occurred on July 1, 1898, and his son, Frank, died about five weeks later, on August 9, 1898. His widow lives at Richmond, Indiana.

William M. Frantz grew up on the farm west of Ladoga and he attended the public schools in his native locality. He continued to work on the home place until his marriage, on September 13, 1888, to Valetta Corn, daughter

of George W. Corn and wife, of Clark township, a complete sketch of which appears elsewhere in this work. For a year after his marriage he continued on his father's farm, then moved to where he now lives in the northwest of Clark township on the farm owned by Mrs. Frantz's father, and he has been successfully engaged in general farming and stock raising in partnership with Mr. Corn.

To Mr. and Mrs. Frantz one son has been born, George F., whose birth occurred on October 13, 1894. He is now in his junior year in the L. high school.

Fraternally, Mr. Frantz is a member of the Independent Order of Fellows at Ladoga. He is a quiet, home man, obliging in disposition, fair in all his dealings.

HENRY T. THOMPSON.

One of Ripley township citizens whom nature seems to have especially designed to be a tiller of the soil is Henry T. Thompson, one of the very best and most highly honored native sons of Montgomery county. The products of agriculture have afforded him high gratification, and in the conduct of his farm the principles he has held have been peculiarly adapted to the successful development and improvement of the varied elements of farm life. He has ever been energetic and enterprising and everything about the place indicates that an experienced hand is at the helm. This gentleman is an informed farmer, who, from a small beginning has built up a comfortable competence and is now enjoying the result of his industry and enterprising property having been acquired through his untiring diligence, foresight and good management. He is one of the oldest native born residents of the western part of the county, and he has lived to see and take part in many of the great changes here, having known the county when it was little more than a vast wilderness when the vast woods stretched in every direction and when the roads were ungraded, the streams unbridged, and when there were very few evidences of present-day civilization.

Mr. Thompson was born in Montgomery county, Indiana, as estimated, on October 17, 1837. He is a son of Alexander and Jane Thompson. The father was born on April 3, 1796, in the state of Pennsylvania. He received a limited education in the primitive schools of his native land and he followed farming and the trade of mill wright during his active life. He came to Montgomery county, Indiana, in a very early day, with

Mathias Williamson came to Greene township from Butler county, Ohio, and settled a mile north of Secor. He had four sons, who still reside in the county, two in Secor and two in El Paso: James A. Williamson, present postmaster of Secor; William N. Williamson, also of that place; John H. and Louis Williamson of El Paso. Other names prominent among early settlers were those of William Marshall, James Miller, Samuel and Richard Patton, Simpson and William McGord. An old settler in the county, altho a more recent comer in the township, is Abbo A. Koerner, who formerly lived between Bureau and Secor.

Judge George W. Patton, who has since won a high position as an attorney and judge, was born in Greene township. He is now judge of the circuit in which Woodford county is located and resides at Pontiac.

Jonathan Wilson came with his father, Nathaniel Wilson, to Metamora in 1835, and moved to Greene township in 1850. He carried the chain while engaged in the surveying of county lines almost seventy years ago. He was quite young at the time, but remembers many experiences met with while he was engaged in the work. They ran across

comers, came to the township. Originally he had come from the same place in Tennessee, but had lingered on the way. Abram Hahn and Jacob Kindelsbeyer came from Ohio, and F. Y. Barnard, from Tennessee. Others followed slowly, but the real growth of the township did not begin until the construction of the Illinois Central. Prior to 1854 there was a postoffice at the home of Francis Y. Barnard, known as Josephine, but upon the completion of the Central road it was transferred to Panola.

The name of Armstrong has figured prominently in the history of the township. John and Alex Armstrong were the pioneers, and had much to do with the development of the neighborhood. Among the younger generation were, William, Garret, Alex, Steven, James, Rankin, John and Miles Armstrong. There are still four representatives of the family residing in Greene, John, Festus, Henry and Grant. Several reside in Secor, among them being Mrs. Rankin Armstrong, John and Miles Armstrong. These with their children, have been well known in that vicinity for many years.

In 1854 John Cauley came to Greene township from Roanoke, Virginia, and in 1856 they were followed by Andrew Ruddell. The widow of the latter still lives in the county, being a resident of Benson.

Michael Evey came to Woodford county from Ohio in 1852. The family originally came from Pennsylvania, but had remained a short time in Ohio before coming on to Illinois. John Evey, a son of Michael, came on the train with the women and children of the party, which was made up of twelve families. The men drove overland to their destination. The family of Mr. Evey settled in Greene township where they resided many years. Among the children, who were well known in the county, were, Mrs. William Meginnis, Mrs. John Frantz, Michael Evey, Jr., David and John M. Evey. Of the family, S. M. Evey, a son of the last named, is the sole representative in Woodford county, and still resides

in Greene township, where he is a prosperous farmer.

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destroyed. Only five years later a second fire occurred and destroyed the block of buildings where Hoffman & Bentfeld's store is now located. Some of the buildings have never been replaced but in most instances new and better structures have been erected.

In 1891 a system of water works was established. A committee, composed of Henry Heineke, Joseph Bucklear and A. H. Brubaker, was appointed to investigate the various plans, and as a result the present system was planned and completed.

The village is governed at present by the following officers: President, Louis Meischner; trustees, Eno. J. Gommels, Joseph Vogel, Theodore Schroeder, C. E. Worthington, M. C. Brubaker, Harm Geiken; clerk, J. W. Heiken; treasurer, R. C. Ficken; marshal, Wirt Folkers.

Roanoke.

Situated in the midst of prairies of unsurpassed fertility, stretching for miles in every direction; underlain with rich deposits of coal that but needed the hand of man to bring them forth that they might pour their wealth into the coffers of the people, it is natural that Roanoke should become a prosperous little city. Forty years ago the present site of the town gave little evidence of important achievements or of the attainment of business success. Within the memory of the older citizens, Roanoke was founded, and these have witnessed its growth from a few scattered houses to a prosperous town with a thriving business.

In 1866 A. J. Darling opened a blacksmith shop in what is now the western part of town. He has witnessed the founding and development of the village. He is now conducting a hotel, while his sons, Darling Bros., have a blacksmith and machine shop. The first store was opened by M. Pifer, who is now one of the pioneer residents of the county. He resides at Eureka and is 93 years of age. He was a pioneer business man of Eureka as well as of Roanoke and was identified with the business interests there until increasing

age caused his retirement from active life. The store he owned was located on the south side of Panther creek. In the early 70's the plans for a new railroad were completed, and in 1872 the Chicago, Pekin and Southwestern was built thru the town. The citizens of the vicinity contributed \$5,000 toward building the road on condition that a switch would be put in at Roanoke. The same year that the railroad was built the town was laid out by D. T. Fauber, Ben G. Kindig and Hiram Barney. The plat was signed December 17, 1872. A postoffice was established and F. C. Pifer was appointed the first postmaster. He was soon succeeded by J. F. Wheelwright, who received a salary of \$12 per quarter. This was soon increased to \$72 a quarter. The office now pays \$1,300 per year.

The town at once began to improve. Henry Frantz put up the first building erected after the town was laid out and John Frantz opened a store. Jacob Engle, son of Peter Engle, the pioneer, also opened a store. The first doctor in the town was Dr. John, who served several terms as coroner. Fauber and Hall first bought grain in Roanoke, altho they never had an elevator. They also dealt in coal. The lumber yard was conducted by Doc Miller, but soon after passed into the hands of Phillip Moore, who was one of the pioneers in business life in that vicinity.

In 1874 a movement was set on foot to organize as a village. The town at that time had the 300 inhabitants necessary for its organization. A petition for such election was circulated and on July 18, 1874, the people voted to incorporate. John Frantz, M. N. Gish and A. Fisher were judges of election, and R. A. Fisher and R. T. Ogle were clerks. The first mayor was S. W. Shulenberger and the first clerk was G. P. Lyons.

The town and country surrounding enjoys an excellent telephone service, operated by the Roanoke Telephone Company, and under the efficient management of E. N. Wheelwright. The first line that sought admission to the

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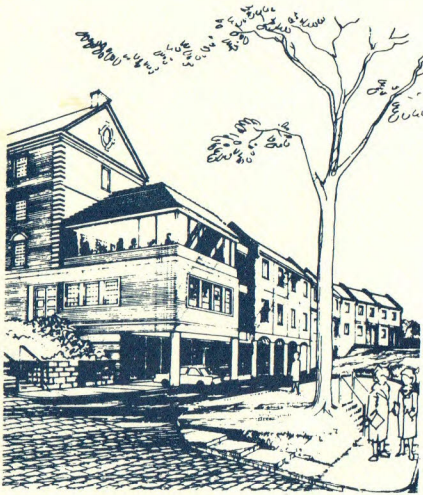

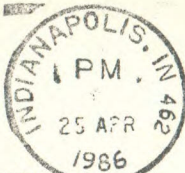
