Also forgot to mention while I was on John Smith family, I copied pages 28 & 29 and will send them.

So will try to answer some of your questions in the Plunkett work you sent. I'm sure the "Mrs. Sarah Meadows" in the obit of John Plunkett in the 1933 Vindicator p.61 is definitely an error. I have found them before, and it's really not too surprising considering that back then practically all articles and information sent in for publication was written in long hand. One can easily see how Meador could become Meadows with a few flourishes instead of a well formed "r". Besides, Sarah Meador lived in Virginia and the Vindicator editors were not acquainted with her, so they had to print their best guess for her name. not have any Plunkett info except Vindicator obituaries, but it seems to me you have figured out Algernon Plunkett's marriages correctly. found nothing pertaining to a first wife; Sally Brubaker's death was too early for the Vindicator, but I was pleased to find in the obituary of Moses Plunkett that he was survived by a brother, Anthony, also a halfbrother and a half sister, so that confirms a second marriage. copy of obit enclosed. Some families were "allergic" to referring to a step-mother, when perhaps she really was a good mother to her step-children, but they didn't once give a thought or care to the trouble it might cause genealogists on down the line!
