Sincere thanks for the information that you sent recently. I really appreciate your phone call and the family history!

I've experienced some electrical problems lately so I was not on my computer for about ten days. I'm a computer/genealogy fanatic so I was going "bonkers" because I couldn't use the computer! Perhaps I have provided you ~~with~~ information that you did not know. As you read it over, please watch for "additions and corrections." It is so difficult for me to catch all my typing errors. I try to "proof" everything while it is on the computer screen but mistakes slip through. I "proof" the printouts each time but I still miss some errors. I also "proof" for formatting mistakes. An example of a formatting error can be found in the middle of page 15. I need to "turn off" superscript and go back to regular print at the beginning of that paragraph.

Comment: The cousin chart on page 10 isn't a formatting error. When I print out multiple generations (six, seven, eight generations) the cousin charts print fine. That one "wrapped around" because this was an abbreviated printout without the children, grandchildren, etc. of Rebecca Frantz and John Frantz. Would you believe? I have over 450 such cousin charts in my database of 30,000+ individuals. There are so many cousin marriages!!

Read over your immediate families and see if you can supply additional information. Perhaps you have something that was not included on the family group sheets. There is still time to get updated info to me before the books go to the publisher. The book, Descendants of Peter Frantz, will be printed later (a month or two).

1. Peter Frantz¹, son of Michael Frantz II and Magdalena Zug. Born, 1765, in Lancaster Co., PA². Died, 1853, in Botetourt Co., VA². Birth(?); circa 1764 (?), in Virginia³. Prob of Est: 22 Jul 1853, in Salem, Roanoke Co., VA⁴.

"Peter Frantz, son of Michael Jr. and Magdalena Frantz, was born in Lancaster Co., PA and moved to Botetourt Co., VA (which is north of Roanoke) with his parents circa 1784.

"He married Catherine Gerst/Garst, daughter of John Nicholas Gerst. She also was born in Pennsylvania and moved to Virginia with her parents. They were possibly married in the early 1790's.

"They were the parents of Catherine, Mary, Nicholas (b. 1797), Anna, Magdalena, Elizabeth, Sally and Barbara. Several of Peter's brothers moved to Clark Co., Ohio but he stayed in Virginia. Five of Peter and Catherine's children moved to Ohio.

"Botetourt County records show that Peter and Catherine bought part of a tract of land on the waters of Carvins Creek, branch of Tinker Creek on 12 Jun 1815 from Peter Heck(?). Peter Frantz is listed in 1850 census - Roanoke Co., VA #279, 57th District. Catherine must have died before Peter as records show that Peter married Mrs. Sarah Pleasants.

"Peter died in 1853, and Will Book 1, Page 86 Roanoke Co., Salem, VA under date of 22 Jul 1853 contains the will of Peter Frantz. He names Catherine Grill, Nicholas Frantz, Anna Fullheart, Magdalena Crist, Elizabeth Trout, Sally Garst and Barbara Howards." Per Gladys Cool Royle in a notebook full of Frantz information loaned to this compiler/editor [LFE] in 1991.

"Records show that Peter Frantz later married Mrs. Sarah Pleasants." Our Garst Family, p. 28.

"Peter was the father of seven daughters and one son. The one son had ten

daughters, no sons. So from the line of Peter, the name of Frantz was not carried on, except that two of the son Nicholas's daughters did marry men by the name of Frantz." Per Lowell Beachler's files.

From The Bare Frantz Manuscript:

"Peter Frantz was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, family tradition has it, in 1767. There being no reliable records otherwise, this date is accepted. He was reputedly 87 years of age at his death, which occurred in 1854. It is likely that he remained in Pennsylvania until after his first marriage which was about 1792 as his first child of record was born in 1794. He was married three times -- first to Peggy Garst, who was the mother of all his children. I have no records of her birth, marriage or death. But her death probably occurred about 1830. He was married second to Margaret Stover on May 27, 1833, Fincastle, Va., record and to Sarah Pleasant on April 13, 1839, Fincastle, Va., record. His third wife outlived him, as she is named in his will. Peter was known to have been in Ohio for some time between 1825-1835. My father, John W. Frantz, left records which say that three brothers, Daniel, Peter and Christian were the oldest Frantzes to settle in Clark County. Two deeds are recorded in Clark County, which show that he bought 80 acres located as the 'east half of the south-east quarter of section 11, township 3, range 9, dated April 22, 1831, from John Fullhart and wife, (his daughter and husband) the price being \$200.00. He sold this same tract to his son Nicholas for \$10.00, the deed being dated September 3, 1834. It is known that most of his children were living in Clark County about that time, so it is very probable that he came here with all his children, he later going back to Virginia and the children going to the vicinity of North Manchester, Indiana. I have not followed up any records in Indiana except those of Nicholas. Sarah married Frederick Garst, Jr., and lived in Virginia and Tennessee where she died.

"Peter Frantz became the owner of considerable land in Botetourt County, Virginia. His executor's report shows the estate had a value of about \$5600.00 which was considerable money for those days. The graves of the Frantzes who died in Botetourt County are of doubtful location but there is a small grave yard on land formerly owned by Peter in which the graves are marked only with rough field stones. No care has been taken of the graves for a long time. But it is probable that Peter and his three wives, his brother David and his father, Michael, are among them. We may never know for sure. He was a minister to the Old German Baptist Church for many years.

"The following is a copy of his will:

Salem, Roanoke County, Virginia

Will Book 1, page 86

July 22, 1853

I, PETER FRANTZ, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and body, and with good memory, I do make and ordain this my last will and testament, in manner and form as follows:

FIRST, I GIVE and bequeath to my beloved wife, Sarah Frantz, twelve hundred dollars in money to be paid her by my executor hereafter named as soon as may be convenient after my decease and also the following property -- one cow to be selected by herself; one bed and bedstead; one beauro; one cheast; one table; all to be selected by herself. One cooking stove and her saddle and bridle and such kitchen and table furniture as

will enable her to keep house comfortable. Secondly, I do also direct that my executor after giving reasonable notice, shall sell at public auction to the highest bidder, all my personal property and also all my lands or real estate. One tract which is my home farm containing eighty six acres, more or less, and also my tract of land lying in Carvens Cove adjoining the lands of David Myers containing one hundred and eight acres more or less and one small tract of land lying at the foot of Tinker Mountain containing sixteen acres more or less upon the following terms-- one half of the money to be paid in hand at the time of sale and the remainder other half in one year after sale of the above named lands, possession to be given immediately of the sale of said lands, and I do direct that so soon as the purchasers of said lands shall pay the last payments, my executor shall make a good and lawful title to the said lands. I do further direct that the balance of my estate whether derived from the sale of the above named lands my personal estate bonds or accounts shall be equally divided between my children, namely, Catherine Grill, Mary Fullhart or heirs, Nicholas, Anna Fullhart, Magdalena Christ or heirs, Elizabeth Trout, Sally Gerst and Barbara Howard, share and share alike. I do direct that the equal respective shares that will be coming to my daughters shall be paid to my said daughters and their children only and for their benefit as I shall further direct and their husbands if any living shall not have any control or weight of whatever. I do appoint my son Nicholas Frantz for guardian for my daughters and children except my daughter Sally Gerst and her children they select for themselves. The said Nicholas Frantz is to receive the portion of money coming due to them from my executor after giving him a clear receipt for the same and then my executor shall pay him over the money and then the said Nicholas Frantz shall pay the same over to his sisters and their heirs as he thinks would be best for them. I do further appoint Christian Wertz for my executor to execute my will, to make sale, collect and pay off according to the Gospel and rules of our church.

In the County Court of Roanoke County, August 21st, 1854, the last will and testament of Peter Frantz deceased was this day produced in Court, and proved in part by the oath of W.M.D. Mitchell one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and the signature of Abraham Brubaker another subscribing witness thereto, who is out of the commonwealth, was also proved by the oaths of Benjamin Brubaker, W.M.D. Mitchell, and Wm. H. Pleasants. The said will was also proved by the oath of Wm. H. Pleasants, a subscribing witness thereto, who was not present at the same time with the other witnesses. And thereupon the said will was admitted to probate.

The preceding copied from The Dore Frantz Manuscript.

Dore M. Frantz continues: "I base my idea that all the children of Peter Frantz finally wound up in northern Indiana on the fact mentioned in his will, that his son Nicholas, who was living west of North Manchester, Ind., when the will was written and probated, was named to be custodian of their portion of the estate. This included all the daughters except Sally, while the heirs of Magdalena Crist, who lived in Clark County, Ohio, where she died Aug. 5, 1825, leaving three children, are mentioned. I take it for granted that Peter inserted this clause in his will, knowing they and Nicholas were living near each other. What birth and death dates I have were taken from tombstones."

The names of Peter's children follow -- with dates. Dore M. Frantz continues: "...Marriages are taken from the records at Fincastle, Va. The last two [Sally Frantz/Frederick Garst, Jr. and Barbara Frantz/Robert Howards] were probably recorded at Salem, Va. Names of Fred Garst and Robert Howards were obtained from other sources but are reliable. John and Henry Fullhart were brothers and Jacob and Catherine Crist were brother and sister."

He married⁵, first, Catherine "Peggy" Garst⁶, daughter of Johann (John) Nicholas Gerst (Garst) and Marie Elizabeth ?Statthalter?. Born, 1765, in Lancaster Co., PA⁷. Died, 1852⁸. Children:

She married¹⁹ William **Crill**⁸, 23 Apr 1816, in Fincastle, Botetourt Co., VA²⁰. Marriage(2): 19 Apr 1816 (?), in Botetourt Co., VA²¹. Born, circa 1789 (?)²². Believed to be son of John and Sarah Grill/Grill, Huntendon Co., NJ, according to Ken Crill. Children:

- i. John W.³ **Crill**. Born, 29 Jan 1817, in Botetourt Co., VA²³. Died, 16 Feb 1899, in Wabash Co., IN²³. He married Mary Ann **Tridle**, 19 May 1839, in Miami Co., OH²³.

- vi. Catherine **Crill**. Born, 5 Dec 1826²⁶. Died, 7 May 1863, in Wabash Co., IN²⁶. She married John L. **Cowgill**, 10 Sep 1843, in Clark Co., OH²⁹.
- vii. Mary **Crill**. Born, 24 Feb 1828³⁰. Died, 4 Apr 1886, in Wabash

Co., IN³⁰. She married Jacob **Hetler**²⁸, circa 1848, in Clark Co., OH³⁰.

viii. **James Crill**. Born, circa 1830 (?), in Clark Co., OH³⁶. Occupation: Farmer. He married Sarah **Fishler**²⁶, 16 Oct 1853, in Seneca Co., OH³⁶.

ix. **Martha Crill**. Born, circa 1834 (?)²⁶. She married Gottlieb **Hetler**²⁶, circa 1851²⁶.

3. **Mary² Frantz** (Peter, 1)⁹.

She married³⁷ John **Fullhart /Fullheart**³, son of Henry **Fullhart** and Mary, 2 Apr 1816³⁵. Marriage(2): 28 Feb 1816 (?), in Fincastle, Botetourt Co., VA³⁹. Born, 14 Dec 1794, in Virginia⁴⁰. Died, 2 Jul 1864⁴⁰. Burial in Delaware Co., IN⁴¹. Children:

- i. Peter³ **Fullhart**. Born, May 1816 (?), in Virginia⁴⁰. Died, 1903⁴⁰.
- ii. John **Fullhart** II. Born, 1818, in Virginia⁴⁰. Died, 1890⁴⁰. He married⁴⁰ Charlotte **Callison**¹⁰.

4. **Nicholas² Frantz** (Peter, 1)⁴². Born, 1 May 1797, in Augusta Co., VA⁴³. Died, 30 Sep 1874, in Acme, Jackson Co., IN⁴⁴. Birth(2): 5 May 1797 (?), in Botetourt Co., VA⁴⁵. Census: 1870, in Pleasant Twp., Wabash Co., IN². Burial in Pleasant Twp., Wabash Co., IN⁴⁶. Emigrated: Sep 1826, in Clark Co., OH⁴⁷.

"Nicholas Frantz was born in Augusta County, Virginia, 1 May 1797. He was married to Catherine Crist, sister of Elder Jacob Crist. Ten daughters were born to them. He came to Clark County [Ohio] in September of 1826. He united with the church in his youth and was called to the ministry in 1832.

"In 1841 he moved to the Eel River Church, Indiana, where later he was ordained to the full ministry. After the death of Elder Joseph Harter in 1861 he became the senior elder and Bishop until his death occurred 30 Sept 1874. His preaching it is said was of the exhortation type. He spoke with much earnestness and feeling, seldom without weeping." History of the Church of the Brethren of the So. District of Ohio, p. 451.

"Nicholas was baptized into the German Baptist Church in his youth. In September, 1826, Nicholas and Catherine moved from Virginia to Clark County, Ohio. They were among the early members of Donnels Creek Church in Clark County. Nicholas was elected a minister in 1832.

"In 1841, Nicholas and his family moved from Clark County, Ohio to Wabash County, Indiana, at that time within the bounds of the Eel River Church. This

country was then a dense wilderness. They settled on a farm about 3-1/2 miles west of North Manchester. They lived in a large brick house and their farm was the center of farming and church activities. They had 120 acres on their farm.

"Nicholas was one of the early leaders of the North Manchester Church, built in 1858 one mile east of his farm. After the death of Elder Joseph Harter in 1861, he became co-presiding elder with Isreal Harter and filled this capacity until his death. His preaching, it is said, was one of the exhortation type. He spoke with much earnestness and feeling, seldom without weeping. He was ordained to the full ministry at this church, sometime between 1841 and 1861.

"Elder Nicholas Frantz died of lung fever on September 30, 1874, aged 77 years, 4 months, and 29 days. His funeral was held October 1, 1874 in the Manchester church, a large congregation attending. The text used was Matthew 25:21. He was survived by his wife, six daughters, 36 grandchildren. (Four daughters and 20 grandchildren had preceded him in death.)

"He was buried in the little cemetery on his farm. It was called the Frantz Cemetery and many early timers and members of the German Baptist Church were buried there. His youngest daughter, Mary, and her husband, Isaac Cripe, moved on the farm. The cemetery was then called the Cripe Cemetery, until years later, the farm was sold to a Grossnickle. It was seldom used for burials after 1881. Catherine Frantz died December 18, 1886, aged 87 years, 10 months, and 16 days, and is buried beside her husband." Per Lowell Beachler's files.

"Nicholas Frantz, only son of Peter and Catherine Frantz, was born May 1, 1797 in Augusta -- perhaps Botetourt -- County, Virginia. He had seven sisters and he later had ten daughters and no sons.

"He met Catherine Crist, an orphan raised by a Leedy family, at a church meeting according to their granddaughter, Sarah Cripe Ranck, in whose parents' home Catherine lived most of her later years. Catherine saw a very likely looking boy among the young folks so she dropped her handkerchief accidentally -- on purpose. Before time to go home, Nicholas had brought the hanky and his name to her.

"Catherine was born Feb. 2, 1799 in Augusta County, Virginia. She had a brother, Jacob Crist, who lived in Clark Co., Ohio by the time she was married.... Nicholas and Catherine were married on Mar. 2, 1819. Susan was born first, then Catharine circa 1822, and Elizabeth in 1824. When Elizabeth was two, the family moved to Clark Co., Ohio settling in the Boonels Creek church where many Frantz and Crist relatives lived. They arrived in Sep. 1826. Five more daughters were born in Ohio.

"Nicholas was elected to the ministry of the Brethren church in 1832. It is said he was a small, precise man who used English readily in his forceful sermons. Catharine was a large, strong, energetic, free-spoken person.

"When Mary was one year old this family with two teams of oxen and wagons moved to Wabash County, Indiana to a farm two miles west of North Manchester. This was in 1841. Phoebe was born there circa 1844.

"Nicholas and Catherine's daughter Mary married Isaac Cripe and they built a large brick house in 1876. A small house of five rooms west of this was built for Nicholas and Catherine, although Nicholas died before the large brick house was built. This house was restored in 1970 and is now the residence of H. E. Terrell D.V.M.

"Nicholas made a cupboard for each of his eight married daughters. The cupboard he made for daughter Elizabeth who married Jacob Cripe is now in the

possession of Doris Cripe, widow of Daniel Cripe.

"Nicholas established a cemetery on the farm where he lived which was originally known as the Frantz cemetery but is now generally called the Cripe Cemetery. This is on a hill and can easily be seen on the north side of S.R. 114. This is not to be confused with the old Cripe cemetery also on the north side of S.R. 114 but is a mile east and on a hill covered by trees overlooking Clear Creek. This cemetery cannot be seen from the road and can be reached by the lane by the creek which goes to buildings further back.

"Nicholas died of lung fever in 1874 at the age of 77 years. Catharine lived twelve more years, living with her daughter Mary Cripe and family part of the time. She died Dec. 18, 1886 at the age of 87. Her obituary states Robert Miller preached her funeral. She died after the 1881 divide and Catharine went with the 'Conservatives' or the Church of the Brethren evidently." Per Gladys Cool Royer in a notebook full of information loaned this compiler/editor early in 1991. Details can also be found in Lost We Forget and Tales of Yester-Years, Vol 2, by Rolland F. Flory, pp. 187-188.

He married⁴⁸ Catherine **Crist**, daughter of Jacob **Crist** and Margarettte **Hobb/Hoh**, 2 Mar 1819, in Fincastle, Botetourt Co., VA⁴⁹. Marriage(2): 2 Mar 1818 (?)⁵⁰. Born, 2 Feb 1799, in Virginia⁵¹. Died, 18 Dec 1886, in North Manchester, Wabash Co., IN⁵². Death(2): 18 Dec 1866 (?)⁵³. Burial in Pleasant Twp., Wabash Co., IN⁵⁴.

"Nicholas Frantz married Catherine Crist, a sister of Elder Jacob Crist on 2 March 1819 in Virginia. She is said to have been an orphan reared by a Leedy family. In September of 1826, the Frantz family moved to Clark County, Ohio, where they were members of the Donnel's Creek Congregation...." Early Brethren in the Eel River Congregation in Kosciusko & Wabash Counties, Indiana, by Lester H. Binnie, p. 49. Children:

1. Susanna³ **Frantz**⁵⁵. Born, 23 Jun 1820⁵⁶. Died, 21 Apr 1889⁵⁷. Burial in Jackson Twp., Kosciusko Co., IN⁵⁸. She married⁵⁹, first, John E. "Big John" **Frantz**⁵⁵, son of Jacob **Frantz** and Sarah **Ebersole**, 23 Jun 1839, in Clark Co., OH⁶⁰. She married⁶¹, second, Jacob **Hay**, 28 Aug 1859, in Kosciusko Co., IN⁶². Marriage(2): 28 Aug 1860 (?)¹².

"Susan, said to have married 'Big John' Frantz in Virginia, moved to Ohio and then to Indiana, died before her father." Lester H. Binnie, Early Brethren Families in the Eel River Congregation in Kosciusko and Wabash Counties, Indiana, (1974) p. 49.

"The records in Probate Book 'B' show that his heirs were established as Susanna Hay, the widow of John E. Frantz, wife of Jacob Hay and the children named.... Other records show that Sarah was found to be of unsound mind and was last under the guardianship of Jacob Frantz." Ibid., p. 45.

Compiler/editor comment: In a letter from Lester H. Binnie, dated 18 Sep 1990: "Question: If John E. Frantz m. Susanna in Ohio and in his Will named her as Susanna, how come she is Sarah on her tombstone? That's what it says; I checked it out

on Sunday last (16 Sep 1990)." -- Compiler/editor answer: I think the "Sarah" buried adjacent to John E. Frantz **is his daughter**.

- iii. Catherine "Katy" **Frantz**. Born, 11 Jun 1822, in Virginia⁶³. Died, 13 Jul 1860, in Napanee, Kosciusko Co., IN⁶⁴. Birth(2): 6 Jun 1822 (?)⁶⁵. Burial in Pleasant Twp., Wabash Co., IN⁶⁶. She married⁶⁷ John L. "Little John"/"Red John" **Frantz**¹², son of Benjamin **Frantz** and Elizabeth **Flory**, 6 Jun 1840, in Clark Co., OH¹². "She is said to have died of tuberculosis" per Lester H. Binnie.
- iii. infant daughter **Frantz**.



"Jacob Crist was born in Augusta County, Virginia on January 16, 1801, son of Jacob and Margarettte (Hoh) Crist. He was an orphan boy and his home among the Brubakers. At the age of 18 he went to Clark County, Ohio. When he was 21 years old, he returned to Virginia and married Magdalena Frantz in 1822. His older sister, Catherine, had married her brother, Nicholas Frantz. Another sister, Elizabeth, married Michael Frantz.

"Jacob and Magdalena came by wagons in 1823 and settled on an 80 acre farm near North Hampton, Pike Township, Clark County, Ohio. They had three children, Joel, Jacob, and Magdalena. Magdalena Frantz Crist died at their home on August 5, 1825, aged 25 years (of childbirth), buried in Meyers Cemetery, Clark County, Ohio.

"Jacob married Catherine Ohmart in March, 1926. Jacob and Catherine moved

to Logan County, Ohio (from 1828 to 1840) where he was elected a minister, then they moved back to North Hampton where they bought the Crist homestead. Jacob was ordained an elder in 1847." Per Lowell Beachler's files.

Compiler/editor comment: Redundant, but worth repeating.

"Jacob Crist, the father of Mrs. Arnold, was born Jan. 11, 1801, in Augusta County, Va., and was married to Magdalena Frantz in Botetourt County, in 1822; emigrated to Ohio by wagon in 1823; settled on eighty acres of land in Pike Twp., Clark County, and cleared up a farm. Magdalena (Frantz) Crist, who bore him two sons and one daughter, vis: Joel, Jacob and Magdalena, died in Clark County, Aug. 5, 1825, at about twenty-five years of age, and is buried in Myers Cemetery. She was a daughter of Peter and Peggie (Garst) Frantz. Jacob Crist was next married to Catherine Ohmart, in Clark Co., in 1826, and in 1828 moved to Logan County, Ohio, bought 160 acres of land, and cut the first tree from the land which was all in virgin forest. Here he hewed out a well improved farm, on which he lived 13 years, then returned to Clark Co., in 1840, and cleared up another farm of 160 acres in Pike Twp., built a large frame dwelling and made a comfortable home. Catherine (Ohmart) Crist bore him nine children, vis: Polly, John, Adam, Christopher, Barbara, Margarette, Samuel, Catherine and Aaron. All his children but two reached mature age and were married. Jacob Crist died in Clark Co., in Jan. 1849, aged forty-eight years and is buried in the Myers Cemetery. He was an earnest Christian and a faithful member of his church, the Old Order German Baptist, for many years holding the office of a minister and elder." Biographical Record of Montgomery Co., Ohio, by Frank Conover, (published by A.W. Bowen & Co.; 1897), according to The Dore Frantz Manuscript. Children:

At the age of twenty-five years was married to Elizabeth Frantz (daughter of Elder John Frantz, of Donnels Creek Church, of Clark County), September 25, 1849, who survives him, and with whom they raised a family of five children to mature age, of which three are members of the Old Brethren Church.

"Brother Jacob was a member of the Old German Baptist Church about thirty-eight years. He was elected to the ministry in the year 1851, and served faithfully in his calling until within the last few years, when his health failed him. His disease was so complicated that the physicians could not agree as to what it was.

"He never neglected attending their regular meetings or appointments when able to do so, and speak to the congregation and admonish the members to their duty.

Hazel Frantz Turner writes (June 1992): "Frost, p. 307, states that 'after Fred's death Sarah, being much younger, married in 1858 Rev. Reuben Bayless, who died some years before she did.' I have seen no other documentation for this, and Rev. Bayless is not listed in the Brethren Encyclopedia nor in the Vindicator Index. Neither does [William Tell] Garst list him in his book. Perhaps he was a minister of another faith, or was one of the free ministers whose name did not appear on any of the surviving records."

She married¹⁵⁰, first, Frederick **Garst** III¹⁵¹, son of Frederick **Garst** I "Indian Garst" and Magdalena **Rauch**, 15 Mar 1829, in Botetourt Co., VA¹⁵². 'Berry -- died in Gage County Nebraska Aug 27, 1882. Sister Frances Berry, wife of Bro. Cleon Berry. She was born October 11, 1848. Sister Berry was a model of a wife, mother, and sister. Her remains were brought back to Hawkins Co., Tenn., from whence she, with her husband and children had emigrated two years before. Her funeral was preached at Whitehorn Church and her body sleeps in the graveyard nearby, to await the trumpet sound, the summons to the first resurrection. May we all remember the bright, Christian character she made among us, and prepare to meet her in eternal bliss. -- W.S. Noe'"

Hazel Frantz Turner continues: "The above Frances Berry may be the daughter of Frederick and Sally, but it has not been proven. The 1880 census of Gage Co., Nebraska lists her as 30 years, Cleon as 40, children Thos 10, Sarah 7, George 5, and Molly b. July 1879. Frances' parents listed as born in Virginia.

"The White Horn Church is in Hawkins Co. near Bulls Gap, TN. It is just over the hills from the Limestone community

where the Garst lived. Cleon Berry was born near Bulls Gap in Hawkins County. He was a brother to my great grandmother who was also born there. Cleon married again and had at least three more children. He returned to Nebraska, but according to the Brethren Encyclopedia, he did spend some time around 1882 at the Cedar Creek Grove OGBB Church about 25 miles north of White Horn. The Daniel C. Bashor family, and Perry and Lucinda (Bashor) Beckner, also moved to Gage Co., NE. Daniel and Lucinda were nephew and niece of Michael Bashor who married Sarah Garst, daughter of Frederick Garst II and his first wife.

"In 1978, I visited the White Horn Cemetery in Hawkins Co., TN. The following inscriptions were found, next to each other:

Frances Berry b. Oct 11, 1848 d. Aug 27, 1882
 Sarah Garst b. Sep 10, 1803 d. Nov 3, 1873
 John Cleon Berry b. Dec 30, 1870 d. Oct 1, 1878
 Benjamin Franklin Berry b. Aug 24, 1877 d. Nov 10, 1878

The two children may have belonged to Frances and Cleon Berry, a reason perhaps for Cleon returning his wife to White Horn for burial. Now, could the Sarah Garst have been her mother, Sally Frantz Garst? **This is all rather speculative. I have no proof at all that Cleon's wife, Frances, was a Garst**, although it seems quite probable. The birth of Sarah is not quite the same as given elsewhere for Sally Frantz Garst, and what about the stated second husband Reuben Bayless? At least this may be a clue to continue further research for the death of Sally Frantz Garst."

Teri Pettit writes: "Lester Binnie's Cemetery Records for PawPaw and Pleasant Townships lists on p. 6, near the beginning of Row 8 in Cripe Cemetery, 'Barbary wife of Robert Howard, died 9 June 1873, age 66 yrs 5 mo 22 d.' From this I have inferred a birthdate of 18 Dec 1806. It is, however, suspiciously close to that recorded for her sister, Sarah (Sally), if the attribution of Barbara's parentage is correct. The data that Barbara d/o Peter Frantz and Catherine Gerst married Robert Howard is from the family group sheet for Peter Frantz on p. 28 of Our Garst Family. I am not aware of the primary source for this marriage (perhaps Peter's will??)."

She married, first, Jacob **Ohmart**, son of Adam **Ohmart** and Christina **Frantz**, 5 May 1853, in Wabash Co., IN¹⁸⁷. She married, second, Moses **Arnold**¹⁸⁸, 15 Oct 1863, in Wabash Co., IN¹⁸⁹.

According to Teri Pettit: "The dates of birth and death are from the gravestone, identified as Louisa, wife of Moses Arnold. Lester H. Binnie's Early Brethren Families of the Eel River Congregation says that Jacob Ohmart married a Louisa Arnold, and he lists as a daughter of Adam Ohmart the Louisa Ohmart who married Moses Arnold. He bases this on the fact that Moses Arnold's wife is buried in the same cemetery row as Adam's family, between his sons Jacob and Levi (both of whom predeceased her), right where she would be in the birth order. However, she does not appear with the Adam Ohmart family on any of the census listings. The others such as Verle Ohmart and Leona Betteridge list the marriage of Jacob Ohmart to 'Louisa Howard.' I strongly suspect that Jacob's widow later married Moses Arnold. It would not seem too unusual to bury her next to her first husband, even though she was already remarried when she died."

Teri continues: "In the 1850 census, Louisa's place of birth is given as Ohio. But the wife of Jacob Ohmart in the 1860 census and the wife of Moses Arnold in the 1870 census both give their place of birth as Virginia."
